- Assist staff and program high school students in engaging program middle school students during weekly afterschool meetings
- Create new programming to enhance participant science understanding
- Assist in other assigned projects and activities to support YTY staff as needed

- Ability to work collaboratively with Museum staff, school teachers, and K-12 students
