

School of Biological Sciences Scholarships for the 2022-23 Academic Year

Application Deadline: January 21, 2022

1. Biology Continuing Student Departmental Scholarship

Up to eight scholarships are awarded each year to currently enrolled Biology majors pursuing their first Bachelor's degree. Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher, must have completed 30 credits at the University of Utah, and must be Utah residents. These are tuition waivers of \$2,500 per semester (Fall and Spring; fees are not covered) for a total of \$5,000. The student must take a minimum of 12 credits per semester. This scholarship requires that the applicant/awardee be a US citizen or permanent resident (green card). If receiving another tuition waiver award, then this award may be reduced or withdrawn.

2. Stephen D. Durrant Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established in 1985 by Stephen D. Durrant, and is open to Biology majors who are finishing their freshman or sophomore years. Two scholarships of \$1,000 will be awarded to cover tuition. A minimum GPA of 3.0 is required. The recipient of this award may apply for a second year, if funding is available. This scholarship requires that the applicant/awardee have graduated from a Utah high school or be a US citizen or permanent resident (green card).

3. Thomas S. Frank Memorial Scholarship

Two awards of \$1,000 are available to Biology majors engaged in research in the area of genetics. The recipient must demonstrate a record of strong academic accomplishment (cumulative University of Utah GPA of at least 3.0) as well as a strong history of involvement in artistic or creative pursuits such as writing, composing (or other musical achievement), painting (or other visual art), or film-making. This scholarship requires that the applicant/awardee have graduated from a Utah high school or be a US citizen or permanent resident (green card).

4. Esther Fujimoto Memorial Endowed Scholarship

This scholarship was established in 2018 by the Fujimoto family to honor the memory of Esther Fujimoto and her career as a research scientist in Molecular Biology at the University of Utah. This scholarship is available to declared Biology majors who are finishing their sophomore or junior years. One scholarship of \$500 will be awarded for use towards the cost of tuition. A minimum GPA of 3.5 is required. Preference will be given to students who are working in a Molecular Biology lab or who are first-generation college students. This scholarship requires that the applicant/awardee have graduated from a Utah high school or be a US citizen or permanent resident (green card).

All scholarships will be awarded for the 2022-2023 academic years.

Deadline for submission of applications is January 21, 2022.

 - graduated from a High School in Utah.
- Declared Biology Major at the University of Utah
- Working towards a 1st Bachelors Degree
- Taking 12 or more graded credit hours per semester of the 2022-23 academic year
- Minimum GPA of 3.0 unless otherwise stated (Continuing and Fujimoto require a 3.5)

- Personal Statement of 1-2 pages discussing the history and development of your interest in science, what you hope to gain from your Biology education, and your career plans. Please include any research experience you might have.

- 1 Letter of Recommendation from a University faculty member familiar with your academic performance or laboratory skills. A School of Biological Sciences instructor is preferred.
- Additional requirements as specified by individual scholarships

Minimum GPA of 3.5.

3. Thomas S. Frank Memorial Scholarship
Include a separate description of your research in genetics as well as your strong history of involvement in artistic or creative pursuits such as writing, composing (or other musical achievement), painting (or other visual art), or film-making.
4. Esther Fujimoto Memorial Endowed Scholarship
Preference is given to students working in a Molecular Biology Lab or who are first-generation college students. Either indicate this in your personal statement or in a separate statement.
